This half term, children at The Willows took part in an 'eyes closed, hands up' survey about their online habits. Over 450 children from Years 1-6 took part, and they've told us:

- Over three quarters of children have their own internet connected device at home
- The majority of children are aware that they can find photos and videos of life at The Willows at our online blog:

- Most children have used their secure login to the Purple Mash website to learn while having fun.
- **70%** of children have used social media online
- Over 50% of children have used social media without adult supervision



## ...News just in...



West Midlands Police has been made aware of an App called "UNICO LIVE". The app is publicised as age restricted 12+ and designed for young people to upload videos of them performing, singing and dancing etc.; it has come to our attention that there is inappropriate content on the platform involving young people which is being investigated.

The content does not appear to be monitored and we urge you to raise awareness widely to increase vigilance and reduce the likelihood of any child being sexually exploited.
