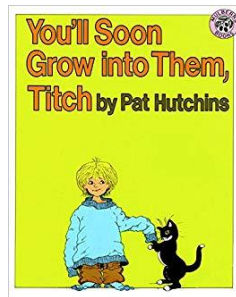
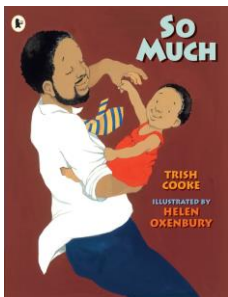


Nursery Autumn Term Newsletter

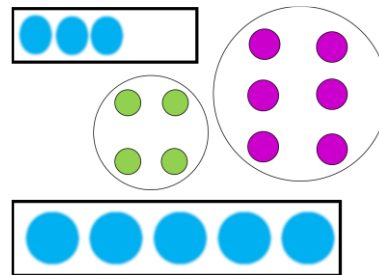
The Nursery team would like to take this opportunity to offer you a very warm welcome to The Willows Primary School. We have enjoyed getting to know you and your child a little better over the past week and are extremely pleased with how they have settled into nursery life so quickly. We recognise the important role that we are going to play in your child's early education and aim to ensure that each and every child is given the opportunity to develop into competent and confident individuals in a warm, safe and caring environment.

Over the coming weeks, we will be sharing the children's special boxes, finding out about their families, likes and interests. There is still time to bring one into school if you haven't had the chance to do so yet and all boxes will be displayed in Nursery throughout the year. Thank you for supporting your child with coming into school independently – they have all done brilliantly and have settled very quickly.

We will be sharing lots of nursery rhymes and songs over the next term and we hope the children will share them with you too. We will be exploring stories linked to the theme of 'This is Me' through a number of stories which include 'So Much', 'From Head to Toe', 'You'll Soon Grow Into Them Titch', and 'My Mum and Dad Make Me Laugh'. Using these stories we will explore families, our bodies, and growth.



In Mathematics we will be using songs and counting rhymes to develop the children's understanding of number and the concept of counting. We will be counting lots of different things and in lots of different ways! We will be learning to recognise dot patterns like the ones you find on a die without counting. We will also be looking at the names and some of the properties of 2-D shapes and comparing them with shapes in our environment.

We have lots of wonderful experiences and activities to share with the children this term and throughout the year. They will be given an opportunity to learn in a fun, practical and imaginative way. We will deliver the ethos of our school motto by exploring, dreaming and discovering together.

In the first few weeks we will be exploring the theme of 'This is Me', where the children will be learning about themselves and their peers. We will then move on to learn more about celebrations and we will be looking at parties, Diwali and Christmas.

Our indoor role-play area is the very recognisable setting of a home, giving the children the opportunity to act out familiar routines. After half term, it will briefly become the home of Winnie the Witch, and later, it will be decorated for Christmas. Outdoor play is a very important part of Early Years education and is, as important as the play that takes place indoors. We will attempt to go outside in most weathers so please ensure that your child is dressed appropriately according to the weather. If your child does not yet have a pair of wellies in school please send these in as soon as possible clearly labelled with their name.

On Fridays we will alternate between our Willows Outdoor Workshop sessions (WOW/Forest Schools) and P.E. These lessons will start on **Friday 20th October** with a P.E. session. Children will need to come to school in their P.E. kits. which they will then wear for the rest of the day. As the weather will be quite cold by then, children will need jogging bottoms and a jumper to wear over their P.E. kit. For our Willows Outdoor Workshops children will need to wear their uniform on the top half and warm clothing on the bottom. We will change into wellies once the children are in school.

Lots of children will be learning to recognise their names both on their pegs and during self-registration. There are lots of activities that you can do at home to support with this (see photograph below).



Children are trying very hard to put their own coats on and take them off and are attempting the tricky challenge of zipping them up! Encouraging your child to do this will help them to be as independent as possible throughout the school day.

In order to ensure that everyone has a happy time at Nursery we encourage positive behaviour in a number of ways - lots of praise, stickers, certificates and the base group special helper. There may be times when some children's behaviour proves to be more persistent and challenging. In these instances the behaviour will be dealt with consistently, fairly and firmly. We will clearly explain to the child why the behaviour was unacceptable and they will be asked to sit on the thinking chair for three minutes to reflect on their behaviour. After this time they will be asked why they needed to sit on the thinking chair and be given the opportunity to apologise. If you wish to read our behaviour policy please visit the school website. These instances tend to become less throughout the year as the children become more familiar with the routines and the expectations of the Nursery.

Proud Clouds

We will be sending home proud clouds in the coming weeks. Please use the proud clouds to share any special achievements that your child has done e.g. counted to 10/20 for the first time or sang a nursery rhyme from beginning to end. We look forward to sharing them in school and displaying them on our board. If your supply needs replenishing please let us know.

General Reminders

- Please ensure that all items of clothing are **clearly labelled with your child's name**.
- We have fruit and milk delivered to school so you do not need to send your child with a snack. We will also be providing the children with cups of water so you don't need to send in a water bottle.
- Please ensure that your child has a bag of spare clothes on their peg should he/she have an accident. These clothes do not need to be uniform.
- If you are unable to collect your child from school for whatever reason please telephone the school office to let us know in advance who will be attending instead.
- Please use our dojo system for getting in touch.
- Please don't send your child to school with toys as they may get lost or broken, which can be very upsetting for them.
- Please do not send your child to school in jewellery and ensure that pierced earrings are removed. **Children are not allowed to wear earrings in school**
